She accentuated that working outside the home helps women to create an identity of their own, apart from their domestic identities of being a mother, sister, wife or daughter. Consequently, it helps women to achieve a sense of independence and fulfilment. Her motivating words were hailed by a resounding applause.

Dr. Molwane's energy and enthusiasm to speak to an audience full of girls pursuing advanced studies was palpable in her speech. She reiterated Ms. Bhathena's view on the importance of work in a woman's life. Citing her own examples of operating in a male-dominated workplace, she demonstrated the need for women to approach their work with utmost sincerity and dedication so as to deter men from stereotyping women as unreliable workers. If Ms. Bhathena's speech had laid the ground for the importance for women to carry forward their academic learning into the world of work, Dr. Molwane's talk established the foundations on which women need to build their identities at their work-place.

To conclude, the awards function was an experience to treasure. It felt special to be part of an organisation such as the WGU that encourages women from all walks of life to pursue higher education and carve out a career for themselves.

I express my heartfelt thanks to the WGU for supporting my goal of pursuing higher education. I look forward to continuing my association with the WGU
